SUBJECT: FILM FOOTAGE ON RELOCATION OF MARSHALL ISLANDS NATIVES

Reference is made to my memo to you, subject as above, of November 5.

I have arranged with Lt. Col. James Warndorf, CO, Lookout Mountain Laboratory, USAF, Hollywood, to send me a listing (detailed caption sheets) of the subject footage. I will bring it to your attention as soon as it arrives. Lookout will be glad to sell you a workprint of any or all of the footage, or a boil-down of the best footage, or can make a completed motion picture.

Lookout would not be in a position to do fresh coverage of the native situation before May, due to NPG commitments. It would appear possible that the Trusteeship Council may wish to have a film report for the next summer meeting. Since AEC is responsible for the health of the natives (with the Navy actually administering), you may wish to check State on this in advance. No doubt it would be possible to find Q-cleared crews, in or out of the Government, who could cover the current situation if Lookout's schedule is too late for UN needs. It may be, of course, that the Navy or Deputy High Commissioner Nucker's staff have been taking progress footage.
