Bob and I thank you for your very interesting letter of 13 June. We are very glad to hear that the exposure is not running as high as had been anticipated. As far as the continuation of this work is concerned, please use your own judgment. He don't want you to sweat over an insignificant number of milliroentgens,

Gen. Cooney has not been able to find any replacement, and it appears that the best arrangement we can make is to ask you, Jack, to stay on until you and Chunk Cooper are satisfied that your services are no longer needed. This is assuming that you will not have to stay there such beyond I August at the latest. We'll be expecting George back soon after I July.

With regard to your letter of 9 June are enclosures: The information enclosed, together with what you may have gathered subsequently on various islands, whould be quite adequate to satisfy any needs at this end. Limit your further survey work to your own needs and interests.

He hope that by this time the difficulty in the CME Compound will have been cleared up satisfactorily. Dean Egyer is sorry that he did not give you more advance information about that situation, but it is not his fault. He had been given to understand that one of the experienced CFR men was to have remained there through June, and he would have known how to make a check with the Eberline apparatus, the instructions for which had to be sent back to LACL because of classification.

Please give my best regards to Chack Cooper. I am sure that you have both been doing a fine job, and we will be very glad to see you back here.
