UK PARTICIPATION IN OPERATION CASTLE

Report to the General Manager by the Commission Member of the CPC Subgroup of Scientific Advisers

- 1. Commissioner Smyth and the Commission Member of the CPC Subgroup of Scientific Advisers advised the Department of Defense on February 25, 1954 that they foresaw no AEC objection to a DOD Subgroup proposal that the United Kingdom be furnished with U. S. obtained filter papers in lieu of the United Kingdom obtaining such papers as previously approved (AEC 597/37).
- 2. Our statement of no objection was based on the understanding that the "hot papers" from our own airplanes in lieu of British flight missions might have less security significance than the papers that would be obtained by the British. We further understood that a policy decision had been made that "hot papers" could be provided in lieu of such British flight missions.
 - 3. Copies of pertinent correspondence are attached.

SUBJECT: (Top Secret) Exchange of Information Under Area 5

1. References.

a. TOP SECRET TWX DA 956320 to Commander JTF 7 from G-3, DA, 29 January 1954, re: JCS decision on British participation in Operation CASTLE.

b. TOP SECRET Memo to Brigadier General Canterbury from Chief, Armed Forces Special Weapons Project, file SWPNV-CPCS-40, subject: "Exchange of Information Under Area 5", dated 16 December 1953.

- 2. One of the two operational RAF Canberra aircraft of the British contingent was lost while enroute to Kwajalein from Australia. Hence, the British capability for obtaining aerial filter samples for each event and for the total series has been drastically impaired.
- 3. AFOAT-1 has been presented with a request by the accredited United Kingdom representative for a portion of aerial filter samples collected by AFOAT-1 Long Range Detection operations, based on the referenced JCS decision on British participation in Cperation CASTLE and on the corrolary U. S. offer to provide "hot papers" from our own airplanes in lieu of British flight missions.
- 4. In view of the change in operational capabilities of the Tritish unit at Kwajalein, and the previous policy decisions on such an exchange, authority is requested for AFOAT-1 to provide the British with exposed Long Range Detection filter papers obtained by AFOAT-1 during Operation CASTLE.
