

To carry out a weapons test series, including all four of the shots previously described, it may be necessary to postpone CASTLE from the fall of 1953 to the spring of 1954. Dr. Bradbury listed several reasons for possibly postponing the test to the following spring.

Second, it is virtually impossible to conduct a fourshot program in the Pacific in the fall because of the weather. He added that the task force had been fortunate to get in two shots during IVY.



In answer to a question regarding DOMINO, the continental test to be held in the fall of 1953, Dr. Bradbury said that in the light of the other scheduled tests, DOMINO would have to be extremely simple because of the shortage of scientific personnel. It would not be desirable to conduct any DOD or FCDA effects tests. It should be a test employing air drops and merely gathering simple yield data.


