



b. How does this proposal affect the question of responsibility for providing storage facilities? Would AEC's quality assurance responsibilities best be met by maintaining complete responsibility for some sites or by maintaining relatively small separate facilities at many sites?

Mr. Dean said he understood that General Fields and General Loper were jointly considering the storage question and that they would present recommendations for its resolution.

#### 3. Value of Atomic Weapons

(See AEC letter to MLC on this subject, dated September 30, 1952, and MLC reply, dated October 16, 1952)

General Bunker referred to the AEC's request that the DOD attempt to assess the relative values of atomic weapons. Studies directed to that end have been initiated; however, more specific guidance on the kind of values in which the AEC was most interested would be helpful.

Mr. Dean said that, recognizing the difficulty of determining weapons values, the AEC had considered that dollar values, relative values as compared with other weapons, or any others that might assist the AEC in weapons production decisions would be useful. The Commission would be happy to receive any information on this subject that might already be available, although the Commission was aware that weapons values are constantly changing.


Er. Boyer suggested that a direct exchange of views on this subject by the appropriate members of the MLC and AEC staffs might be useful in further defining the problem.

## 4. Preliminary Fiscussion of Special Materials (Tritium) Production

(See letter from the AEC to the MLC on this subject, dated October 6, 1952, and MLC reply, dated October 10, 1952)

The group discussed the problem of guidance for the AEC concerning the DOT's requirement for weapons employing tritium; the probable accuracy of the Division of Military Application's estimate of that requirement; and the significance of this question to the Savennah kiver project.

In the course of discussion the following points were made:




- b. A formal decision by the DOD on requirements for weapons employing tritium will probably not be reached in the immediate future. EMA's estimate of that requirement is perhaps somewhat low.
- c. Savannah River construction has reached the point where questions of reactor loading have become acute. The AEC now plans a normal loading for the first reactor. It is important to have as firm knowledge of probable DOD requirements as possible by about the middle of November.

- d. There are certain specific questions that must be answered as fully as possible by that time, in the following order or priority:
  - (1) How should the first Savannah River pile be loaded?



- (3) Are the AEC estimates of the Department of Defense requirements approximately correct?
- (4) Shall a converter reactor be constructed?

  At an AEC-MLC conference to be held on November 18, the MLC will undertake to provide as full information or possible on matters affecting the answers to these questions.

#### 5. General Discussion

Mr. Dean commented on the problem of public announcements with respect to Speration IVY. The AEC and DOD have agreed that except for statements agreed upon beforehand, no comment will be made after the shots.

Problems of labor relations at Paducah were briefly reviewed.
