

Dear Mr. President:

On November 23, 1957, I wrote to you concerning our plans for testing in Operation HARDTACK, the spring 1958 test series at the Eniwetok Proving Ground. In this letter, I stated that in January I would submit to you a listing of the shots planned, their individual objectives and the amounts of special nuclear materials concerned.



Since writing you, our plans for testing in HARDTACK have had to be revised somewhat. On December 12, 1957 we were informed by the Department of Defense that the development of the POLARIS missile gystem was being accelerated and were requested to accelerate the Estimoster was being accelerated and were requested to accelerate the Estimostaria warhead. In order to meet the new POLARIS schedule it has been necessary to revise the test program connected with development of this warhead. Two nuclear shots have been added to the one POLARIS shot earlier scheduled in the HARDTACK program. In addition. a third contingent shot will be readied to be fired only if the two scheduled shots do not give the necessary data to meet the early THE Capability POLARIS requirement.

> It has been necessary also to add to the program one other laboratory Htest.

However, it is now felt necessary to test this second device in order to obtain the required data.

One other test of the original program has been deferred to the underground test series of very low-yield devices planned for the fall 1958 at the Nevada Test Site which I described in my November 23 letter, and which will be conducted as a separate test series to be known as Operation MILLRACE.

In summary, the overall change to the HARDTACK program has been an increase of three scheduled shots, making a total of 20 scheduled laboratory and 5 scheduled DOD effects shots. In addition, there will be two contingent shots whose firing depends on the outcome of other shots in the series. Attached to this letter is a summarization of the scheduled and contingent nuclear shots in the HARDTACK and MILLRACE programs and their objectives. Calculations on the basis of this revised program, including latest laboratory estimates of the specific yields of the various shots, reveal that its contribution to world wide fallout is essentially the same as that of the program presented to you in my letter of November 23, 1957.

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
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
