A group of officers on TDY¹⁶ at the University of California for a specialized course in Tropical Meteorology were absent from part of the training, but completed the necessary training after their return to this headquarters on 4 August.

In accordance with the wishes of General Plantzberg, Commander of Task Group 132.4, as set forth in his letter of 23 June, only the most highly qualified and desirable personnel were selected for the project by the 6th Weather Squadron (Mobile). This was done to minimize man-

On 10 July, a check was made of the allowances in 13-
allowance letter from Task Group 172.4, dated 15
February, 1951: "silver of 13-allowance", and on 11 July
a check was made on all personnel.

A uniform clothing inspection was given to all per-
sonnel on 13 July and some shortages were noted. Per-
sonnel were ordered to bring their clothing up to the
minimum authorized clothing allowance¹⁷ by 15 July, the

All personnel of the weather office field were advised of their opportunities for educational advancement while in the field.¹

On 11 August 1950, Captain Love was relieved of his duties as commanding officer of the station 112.4.3.2 in order to be relieved of the United States. Major Joseph W. Thompson, USMC, was assigned the duty of commanding officer of the station.²

UNIFORMS AND EQUIPMENT

On 1 July Captain Love requested Force Supply at higher Air Force base on the availability of class "K" uniforms and tropical sun helmets. He was later advised that class "K" uniforms would be issued by the Army Quartermaster Corps at Eniwetok and that sun helmets were available here.

Organizational clothing and equipment, including sun helmets, was issued to all members of shipments 6003-TI and 6003-HI on 1 July and 23 July respectively. The other shipments were issued their organizational clothing and equipment by 20 August. The footlocker and blanket were

TRAINING RESULTS

This is a breakdown of the results of the training program. Although the program ended on 11 July, late arrival of many people necessitated continuance of training after that date. Those late arrivals were brought up to the required level of training by special classes after 11 July. The classes brought them up to date on what they had missed, and were not scheduled so no training schedules for them appear in this report. 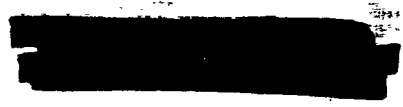

1. GENERAL SITUATION: The Atomic Energy Commission, in collaboration with the Department of Defense, will conduct two (2) nuclear tests at BIKINIEOK ATOLL during the fall of 1952. Joint Task Force 132, under the command of Major General Clarkson, U. S. Army, has been organized to conduct this operation. The operation has been classified SECRET and has been assigned the AEC Code Word IVY. The Code Word IVY is classified SECRET when associated with the test; when used alone its classification is RESTRICTED. The objective and purpose of the nuclear tests are classified TOP SECRET. Air Force participation in the test will be controlled by Task Group 132.4, Provisional, under the command of Brigadier General Glantsberg. The Test Services Unit, designated as Test Services Unit 132.4.3, Provisional, and under the command of Colonel Roy W. U. Love, Jr., will consist of Military Air Force personnel and will integrate each of the IWS Services required in support of this project. (See Annex "A", Meteorological Services).
2. Enemy Interest: Because of the nature of this project, all friendly powers will undoubtedly have interest in the tests. All reference to the security provisions is mandatory. (See Annex "B", Security).
3. Friendly Forces: JTF 132 and supporting Army, Navy, and Air Force units as follows:

- (2) Develop Weather Plans and Forecasts at the direction of the [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] of the [REDACTED]
 - (3) Establish requirements for weather reporting from the outlying islands. Requirements will be forwarded direct to the outlying detachment with an information copy to 00 132.4.3.2.
 - (4) Collect meteorological data for historical record and reports. This documentation will be coordinated and/or jointly prepared with the Staff Weather Officer 00 132 (Commander Base, USAF).

b. Weather Reporting Detachment 1 will be located on BUNTI ATOLL and will accomplish the following:

- (1) Provide three-hourly surface observations.
- (2) Provide two (2) rawinsonde observations daily at 0900Z and 1500Z.
- (3) Maintain a low frequency homing beacon for Task Force aircraft twenty-four (24) hours per day.
- (4) Maintain visual navigation aids already installed on the atoll.
- (5) Provide other Meteorological Reports as required by Task Element 132.4.3.2 or the JTFMOC.

c. Weather Reporting Detachment 2 will be located on MAURO ATOLL and will accomplish the following:

- (1) Provide three-hourly surface observations.
- (2) Provide two (2) rawinsonde observations daily at 0300Z and 1500Z.
- (3) Maintain a low frequency homing beacon for Task Force aircraft for operation upon request.
- (4) Provide other Meteorological Reports as required by Task Element 132.4.3.2 or the JTFMOC.

e. Weather Reporting Detachment 3 will be located on MUSAIE ISLAND and will accomplish the following:

- (1) Provide three-hourly surface observations.
- (2) Provide two (2) rawinsonde observations daily at 0300Z and 1500Z.
- (3) Provide other Meteorological Reports as required by Task Element 132.4.3.2 or the JTFMOC.

f. Weather Reporting Detachment 4 will be located on POKIPI ISLAND and will accomplish the following:

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- [REDACTED]
- (1) Provide hourly surface observations.
 - (2) Provide two (2) rawinsonde observations daily at 0500Z and 1500Z.
 - (3) Maintain a low frequency landing beacon for Task Force aircraft for operation upon request.
 - (4) Provide other Meteorological Reports as required by Task Element 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 or the S-100.

4. General Instructions:

- (1) Each detachment will be controlled and administered in accordance with existing Air Force directives. Laws of the Trust Territories where appropriate will be followed. On the populated outer islands the civil administration on basic law provisions of the High Commissioner. All Air Force personnel will be treated in all policies relating to indigenous inhabitants. Each detachment, wherever available, the first official act of each detachment commander after the initial destination will be to call on the Civil Administration for assistance. Copies of this order will be furnished each detachment commander.
- (2) Each detachment will be a self-supporting unit.
- (3) All surface observations will be taken in accordance with Weather Bureau Manual of Surface Observations, "Circular H."
- (4) All rawinsonde observations will be taken in accordance with Weather Bureau Manual of Rawinsonde Observations, "Circular P."
- (5) Additional surface and/or rawinsonde observations will be made at the discretion of the Chief, JETCO.
- (6) The chronological sequence for execution of the Task Element mission is shown in Annex "C", Sequence of Events.
- (7) Each detachment will maintain and operate a CW send-receive radio station for communications purposes.
- (8) All Task Elements will periodically review the principles of radiological safety. (See Annex "D", Radiological Safety).
- (9) This order is effective 1200 CST (Z minus six (6) hours), 23 July 1952. Extensive coordination precluded earlier issue.

4. ADMINISTRATIVE AND LOGISTICAL MATTERS:

- a. Administrative and logistical (See Annex "E", Administration).

5. COMMAND AND SIGNAL MATTERS:

- a. Command Relationship (See Annex "F", Command Relationship).
- b. Command Post (prior to movement to the forward area):

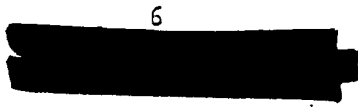

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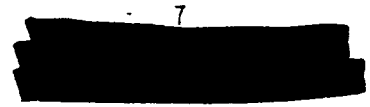

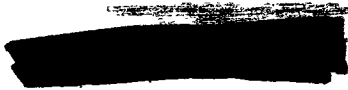

1. GENERAL:

- a. Meteorological facilities and services in addition to those normally provided by Air Weather Service and CINCPAC, will be established in the BIKINI-ENiwETOK area for support of Operation LULU.
- b. To provide this augmentation of meteorological facilities East Service Unit has assigned task elements as follows:
 - (1) The Weather Forecasting Element to be stationed at ENiwETOK (08°45'N, 157°00'W) with a Weather Central to be stationed at ENiwETOK for the purpose of conducting surface observations and long-range tracking flights and accomplishing sampling missions.
 - (2) The Weather Reporting Element to be stationed at ENiwETOK (08°45'N, 157°00'W) and observing detachments to be stationed at BIKINI ISLAND (12°00'N, 163°20'W); FOMARE ISLAND (5°30'N, 153°10'W); USATE ISLAND (5°21'N, 153°00'W); and ENiwETOK (7°05'N, 157°20'W) for the purpose of:
 - (a) Providing operational weather forecasting service to the Commander, Joint Task Force 132 and the Task Group Commanders for the purpose of the IVF mission.
 - (b) Providing forecasting service for flight operations at ENiwETOK.
 - (c) Conducting meteorological studies.
 - (d) To provide additional surface observations.

2. UTILITIES:

- a. In addition to the special facilities mentioned in paragraph 1 above, the following services and facilities presently available will be utilized to provide a meteorological analysis of the entire Pacific Area:
 - (1) Surface and upper air observing stations of the Global Weather Network along with the associated weather communications service.
 - (2) Weather reports and weather observations from all types of flight weather reports from aircraft operating in the Pacific Area.
 - (3) Surface reports from ships operating in the Pacific Area.

1. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS:

- a. The Commanding Officer, IE 132.4.3.2 is responsible for the overall security for IE 132.4.3.2. Security activities will be performed through normal communication channels. Travel control Form 1001001 to KUNMUCH shall be operated by the IE 132.4 Security Office.
- b. The Commanding Officer of IE 132.4.3.2 is responsible for the following:
 - (1) Proper clearance of all personnel assigned or attached to IE 132.4.3.2 in accordance with instructions contained in Security Letters, Headquarters, Joint Task Force 132.4.3.2 (Group (Security) Headquarters, 405 series).
 - (2) Identification of all personnel assigned or attached to IE 132.4.3.2 in the proper manner of handling classified documents.
 - (3) Continuous action to insure that all personnel realize the seriousness of loose talk and divulgence of classified information concerning the activities of Operation "LIVE". In this connection, the following will be brought to their attention and explained to them in detail:
 - (a) AFR 205-1 and changes.
 - (b) AFR 205-25.
 - (c) Section 10(b) (1), (2), (3) and (4) of the Atomic Energy Act of 1946.
 - (d) Section 31 and 32 of the Espionage Act.
 - (e) Compliance with JTF 132 Security Letters.

2. ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS OF INFORMATION FOR SECURITY OFFICE:

- a. A report will be made to the Commanding Officer, IE 132.4.3.2 immediately when:
 - (1) The loyalty and character of any IE 132.4.3.2 personnel is doubtful.
 - (2) Possible espionage is indicated.
 - (3) Any possibility of sabotage exists.

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(4) Any operations on or off official aircraft, or those of submarines or other vessels, in the area.

(a) Visual Signaling:

All sightings excepting the Morning Star and the Romance, Protestant and Catholic mission ships, will be reported to Commander Task Group 152.4 immediately for relay to CINCPAC, COMSOP, COMUSMACV, and COMNAVSTA. Detailed instructions will be published later.

(5) Any questionable acts or incidents observed which tend to create suspicion.

3. SECURITY CLEARANCES: Responsibility of Commanding Officer, TG 152.4.3.2.

- a. Compliance with C. 1-152 Security Matter in fulfilling clearance requirements set forth for Operation IVY in that all personnel who in the performance of their assigned duties may be required to gain Restricted Data Information (through contact with RDI personnel and/or their counterparts) will be immediately processed for Atomic Energy Commission "Q" type clearance in accordance with C. 1-152 Personnel Clearance Policy (C. 1-152 Security Matter No. 7, dated 3 October 1951).
- b. Personnel not having need for "Q" clearance will have initiated requests for National Agency Check prior to departure for the forward area. Personnel submitted for a NAC must be United States Citizens and a detailed review be made of the individual's personnel file for possible derogative information, i.e., AFR 39-3.
- c. Commanding Officer, TG 152.4.3.2, Provisional, may screen the records of an individual to determine whether or not he is a good security risk, and if so, order him to the forward area. A request for a National Agency Check must be initiated sufficiently in advance to permit completion of the check prior to 1 November 1952.
- d. Each individual must be cleared for travel to the forward area in accordance with CINCPAC serial 020, dated 1 April 1952.
- e. Personnel who, as the result of investigation, are not considered good security risks will be eliminated from the Task Element.
- f. Proper security clearance requirements for replacement personnel must be accomplished by the parent organization prior to departure of the replacements to the forward area.

4. CONFIDENTIALITY: No censorship of personal mail is contemplated at USMCV, COMUSMACV or the forward islands during Operation "IVY".

- a. Personnel will be briefed prior to departure from duty location or location regarding the necessity of confidentiality and informed that they will be exposed to a great deal of classified information which is vital to the security of the nation and that the duty of a citizen is a continuing obligation regardless of assignment or location.

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By the following, information to be included in paragraph 1.1.1.1:

- (1) Existence of JMW-152.
- (2) Inform your constituents that you are a member of Weather Reporting Element 152.4.3.2, Provisional or the name 152.4.3.2, Provisional, may be used, and advise them of the name of the ship you are on. It is this with the name of any other islands to be mentioned other than the one on which you are stationed.

5. CLASSIFICATION:

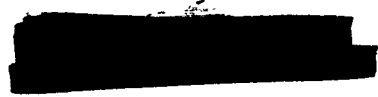

6. CONTRABAND:

 - (1) All photographic equipment.
 - (2) All equipment adaptable for use by either visual or electronic communications (Radio transmitters and related material).
 - (3) All optical equipment (except eyeglasses).
 - (4) All materials with explosive capabilities.
 - (5) All weapons.
 - (6) All traps and intercepting coverages.
- b. WEAPONS, BIRDS, MISERS, MASTERS, POWERS: Same as in 7a above with the exception of photographic equipment.

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9. REFERENCES:

a. Commanding Officer, II 1120th AFSG:

A weekly report will be sent to Commander First Group 1120th AFSG, Security Officer, covering matters pertaining to Security and Security Tabernacles.

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1. SEQUENCE OF OPERATIONS:

a. Zone of Interior Phase:

- (1) The culmination of training in the Zone of Interior for increments of IE 132.4.3.2 will be attained upon completion of the PCM training program.
- (2) All increments of IE 132.4.3.2 will have departed for the forward area by 21 September 1952.

b. Forward Area Phase:

- (1) Upon arrival in the forward area Commanding Officer, IE 132.4.3.2 will assume operational control of the "MILITARY" Base Station and Radiocheck Station. (Authority, US Operations Plan 7-52).

(2) PropNet:

- (a) All Weather Reporting increments will be in place at the outlying islands by 6 September 1952 and operational by 20 September 1952. Headquarters IE 132.4.3.2 and Weather Control increments will be in place and operational at ENWALBERN and ENWALBOK respectively by 1 October 1952.

- (b) Training will be continued with emphasis upon radiological safety, first aid, and evacuation and emergency procedures. For personnel based on ENWALBOK, appropriate emphasis will be placed on familiarity with plans for ground defense of the island and familiarity of military personnel with individual weapons.

(3) Shot:

- (a) When all Task organizations report that they are ready Commander JTF will announce H-Day.
- (b) The first detonation will be executed when detailed analysis of all available meteorological data indicates favorable weather conditions. Similarly, rehearsals and weather conferences will be repeated for the second detonation.

2. SCHEDULE OF EVENTS:

a. Definitions:

- (1) H-Day (H) - Date of Detonation for Pacific Detach.
- (2) K-Day (K) - Date of Detonation for Hawaiian Detach.

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- (3) Roll-up - Date of conclusion for IVY and Date preparation for return to MI may begin, as directed.

1. DEFINITIONS:

The term Radiological Safety Operations (short term RAD SAFE OPS) is a general term used herein to denote the broad aspect of safety for personnel in radiological safety procedures, passive radiological safety measures, decontamination activities for personnel and material, and the collection, recording, and evaluation of research data to be translated into operational procedures for Air Force usage. The terms Radiological Safety - RAD SAFETY - RAD SAFE are used interchangeably throughout this order to denote the specific application of Radiological Safety Operations for the provision and avoidance of health hazards to personnel. Profiling equipment is radiation detection equipment, such as Geiger-Mueller Survey Meters and Gamma Ionization Chamber Survey Meters.

2. PURPOSE:

The purpose of this order is to furnish instructions to all increments of Task Element 132.4.3.2 for the conduct of Radiological Safety Operations on Operation IVY (RADIATION).

3. RESPONSIBILITY:

The conduct of Radiological Safety Operations is a direct responsibility of Commanders at each level of Command, including Detachment Commanders.

4. TASK OF WEATHER REPORTING ELEMENT 132.4.3.2:

- a. Provide and train one Rad-Safe monitor for each of the Weather Reporting Islands.
- b. Provide and maintain communications equipment as required.
- c. Provide the Commander, Joint Task Force 132, and other Groups and Units weather data as required.

5. PERSONNEL:

TE 132.4.3.2 will have trained personnel capable of performing Rad-Safe operations as required or directed by the Staff Radiological Safety Officer and will provide one (1) monitor for each of the Weather Reporting Islands.

7. SUPPLIES AND EQUIPMENT:

Requirements for radio equipment, decontamination equipment, and supplies for the Rad-Safe program at the forward area will be established by the Test Support Unit. The Commanding Officers, TE 132.4.3.2 will coordinate with the Commanding Officer, Test Support Unit

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to procure sufficient radio equipment for delivery to the outlying
Weather Reporting Stations.

RADIOLOGICAL SAFETY REGULATIONS

NOTE: The following regulations are extracted from the Radiological Safety Regulations published in Task Group 132.4, Operations Plan 1-52.

All military personnel who will be working in areas containing radioactivity or working with radioactive materials will be governed by the following regulations.

1. Within three (3) months prior to departure from the United States, those persons will receive a complete radiological physical examination, including history, chest x-ray and urinalysis in accordance with "Checklist of Atomic War Zone for Medical Officers," AFM 120-11, and paragraph 4, change 2, Section IV, Appendix, JEF 132 Operations Order 10, 1-52, concerning radiological physical examinations. The Radiological Physical Examination Report, Form 33, will be accomplished in quadruplicate; one copy will be placed in the individual's permanent medical record file, and three copies will be forwarded to the Radiological Safety Officer, Task Group 132.4, who will make disposition as required.
2. Upon termination of service and prior release from JEF 132, personnel will undergo further examinations if prescribed by Radiological Safety Officers.
3. The permissible radiological exposure will be established by OEF 132.
 - a. Personnel reaching or exceeding this exposure level will be withdrawn from further work requiring possible exposure to radiation.
 - b. Dosage will be kept to a minimum consistent with operational requirements.
4. Names of all individuals who are expected to enter radioactive areas will be submitted to OEG 132.4 on the form of an eligibility list three weeks prior to the first test. Subsequent changes to the original list will be submitted as they occur.
5. Individuals or parties working on contaminated equipment will be accompanied by Rad-Safe monitors. These monitors will inform persons in charge of parties of radiological hazards involved and when radiation tolerance has been reached.
6. Personnel, upon completion of work in radioactive areas or with radioactive materials, will turn in film badges at the Personnel Decontamination Center. Badges will be forwarded to the laboratory of Task Group 132.1 where all processing and recording will be accomplished.

1. GENERAL RESPONSIBILITY:

2. Prior to arrival in the operating area, all increments attached to TE 132.4.3.2 will receive administrative and logistical support from 6th Weather Squadron. 4. TRANSPORTATION:

Land, sea and air transportation will be furnished to increments of TE 132.4.3.2 in accordance with procedures laid down in Appendix 3, Transportation, to this annex.

5. SERVICES:

Services are discussed in detail in Appendix 4, Services, to this annex.

6. MAINTENANCE:

All increments of TE 132.4.3.2 will perform all maintenance within the capabilities of the personnel and equipment available. Maintenance required beyond these capabilities will be brought to the attention of the Commanding Officer, TE 132.4.3.2 for appropriate action.

7. PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATION:

Commanding Officer, TE 132.4.3.2 will administer all Task Elements of his command in accordance with procedures laid down in Appendix 5, Personnel Administration, to this annex.

SUPPLY

1. WEATHER SUPPLY:

a. Initial ZI:

To meet the ZI requirements for organizing, manning, equipping and training of TE 132.4.3.2 supply procedures will be as outlined in AF 37-1.

b. Initial Supplies Requirements:

Initial supply action for those supplies and equipment required in the various operational areas by all elements of TE 132.4.3.2 will be in accordance with procedures outlined in Paragraph 4 of Ltr, HQ AFM, 2301: Supply Support Plan for JTF 132, 10 March 1952. See Attachment A, Supply Support Plan for JTF 132, to this appendix.

c. Initial Operational Area:

Units based on ENHETOK Atoll will procure all items of common supply from ENHETOK Supply Center operated by Task Group 132.2.

- (1) Common supply items of Memorandum Receipt nature furnished by Task Group 132.4 will be issued to the Responsible Officer of TE 132.4.3.2 Weather Central who will maintain memorandum receipt accounts.
- (2) Expendable supplies issued by the ENHETOK Supply Center will be direct issues. The Weather Central will draw all other items of supply from the Air Force account AF 2272 SO.
- (3) An Air Force Supply Account will be established at KAWALEIN for the storage and issuance of Air Force items. Over the counter issues direct from warehouses will be made, utilizing Air Force Form 51A "Daily Receipt Issues". Stock replenishment or emergency request will be processed by the Air Force Accountable Officer.
- (4) Resupply of the outlying weather islands will be accomplished by airlift from KAWALEIN twice monthly. This will include government issue and personal items purchased by the individual.
 - (a) At the time of each resupply trip, Detach Unit Commanders will submit a list of items to be delivered with the next resupply flight to Commanding Officer TE 132.4.3.2.

2. SUPPLIES TO ACCOMPANY GROUPS:

In general, supplies and equipment to accompany increments to the operational sites will include individual equipment and items of organizational equipment required for use enroute to, and for immediate use upon arrival at the forward area. See Attachment 2, Clothing, to this appendix.

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3. REPLENISHMENT POLICY, INCLUDING:

- a. Original orders for all classes of supply except subsistence, for the four (4) "Weather Reporting Enclaves" at HNSAWE, WURO, PUNEE, and BIFINI will be for four (4) months. Calculation stores are based on thirty (30) men for six (6) months.
- b. Resupply requests for all classes of supply will be for thirty (30) days only.
- c. Each Detachment Commander will devise his own system of maintaining a "Running Inventory" so that a day to day consumption rate is known and reorder level will be readily available. A stock level of thirty (30) days will be maintained; in order to do this the reorder point will be when the stock level reaches twenty-five (25) days. When the reorder point is reached resupply action as indicated in 1c (4) (c) above will be initiated.

4. SHARIN OF COMMUNICATIONS EQUIPMENT:

Requisitioning of Communications equipment and supplies is being accomplished by AACGS and the Communications Section, Headquarters, Task Group 132.4.

a. Crystals:

The crystals required for the communications equipment on the outlying weather islands have been requisitioned by Hq, TG 132.4 and will be picked up by each Detachment Commander at Hq, 1310th AACGS Group, FICOM, Air Force Base, TERRITORY OF HAWAII.

5. STORAGE OF SUPPLIES:

All supplies stored on the outlying weather islands will be so dispersed that in case of a disaster, the complete destruction of any one item which would cause the detachment to cease operating until the item can be replaced will not occur. An example is Motor Fuel. Sufficient quantities should be dispersed from the main storage area to provide a seven (7) day supply. Motor fuel will be stored in accordance with T.O. 06-1-9, Container Storage of Gasoline, Jet Fuel, and oils, 15 Dec 49, and Army Regulation 650-20, Precautions in Handling Gasoline, 20 May 1940.

6. EMERGENCY PLAN FOR SUPPLIES:

In case of emergency, supplies can be procured from Hq, TG 132.4.3.2 by radio call to Commanding Officer TG 132.4.3.2. The full description as listed in the UFR-L will be given as well as a brief explanation as to how the items is to be used. This latter information will aid Hq, TG 132.4.3.2 in locating a substitute if the requested item is not available. If there is no supply information available on the item desired, give a brief description and where applicable refer to figures or schematics in technical publications.

Each Detachment Commander will be supplied with the publications listed on Attachment B, Publications, to this Appendix. Any additional publications required will be requested from Commanding Officer IE 132.4.3.2.

REPORTS OF SURVEY:

a. The Commanding Officer IE 132.4.3.2, Provisional, will prepare, review and submit Reports of Survey as outlined in paragraph 5b, Annex "J", Operations Plan 1-52, Headquarters, Task Group 132.4. IE 132.4.3.2 will prepare the Reports of Survey for all instruments except the Weather Central. Reports of Survey required by the Weather Central will be prepared by the Detachment Commander holding the Provisional Receipt Account for the Weather Central.

b. The Detachment Commander will forward the following information when a Report of Survey is required.

- (1) Date, Place and by whom the missing item was last seen and used.
- (2) Date, Place and by whom the absence of the item was first noticed.
- (3) The stock number and description of the item.
- (4) A complete statement as to dates and circumstances. This statement should be prepared by the person having custody of the item (Detachment Commander).
- (5) A statement by the person who is requesting the Report of Survey. This statement will be in the form of a Certificate if being made by an officer, and an affidavit if being made by an airman.
- (6) If deemed necessary by the Detachment Commander statements may be taken from witnesses or persons involved and forwarded along with the other statements.
- (7) Photographs when damage has occurred will be helpful to establish responsibility, and should be submitted.

c. The Detachment Commander will review all information submitted for inclusion with a Report of Survey for accuracy of data contained therein.

ACCOUNTABILITY FOR SUPPLIES AND EQUIPMENT:

a. The accountability of supplies and equipment issued to the Detachment Commanders for the outlying weather islands will be terminated as indicated in Attachment "E", Authority to Terminate Accountability of Supplies and Equipment for Units to be

SUBJECT: Supply Support Plan for JTF 132

1. The following Headquarters Supply Division Logistical Plan for the AF portion of Project "HIT", JTF 132, will apply to all combat elements unless otherwise indicated or modified by HQ, 132.

2. Task Group 132.4 of JTF 132 is comprised of the following:

a. Task Group 132.4

b. Test Support Unit

(The following are components of this Unit: Supply, Maintenance, Operations, Personnel Administration. The aircraft assigned to this unit are C-47, L-13, W-19 and D-17 aircraft.)

c. Test Aircraft Unit

(The following are components of this Unit: Jet Fighter Operations, Conventional Bomber Operations. The aircraft assigned to this unit are F-84G, B-29, B-36, B-47 and B-50 aircraft.)

d. Test Service Unit

(The following are components of this Unit: Weather Stations, (four individual islands), AMOS, MATS Traffic Service, Weather Recon and Air Rescue. The aircraft assigned to this unit are B-29, WB-29, C-54 and SA-16 aircraft.)

3. ZONE OF INTERIOR TRAINING REQUIREMENTS:

a. In order to meet Zone of Interior training requirements for HQ, Task Group 132.4 and Test Support Unit stationed on islands, all AF items will be requisitioned by Hixland, AF Property accountable supply officer, AF 380, directly upon the applicable Western Canal Depot as indicated in AF Manual 47-1, Section 11.4.1, Part 1. Army purchase property will be requisitioned from the appropriate unit outlined in paragraph 11.4.1, Part 1. All Army purchased property shall be requisitioned in accordance with AF 47-2, Section 11.4.1, Part 1. (This supersedes AF 47-17 dated 15 September 1951). All clothing stock and items are requisitioned the stock and

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of which 10% of the total will be covered by the existing activity on the existing contract.

- b. All units to be used on items other than assigned AD will requisition training requirements at the local level training is being conducted.

4. INITIAL OVERSEA REQUISITIONING:

- a. SMMA, McClellan AFB, Sacramento, California, is the designated monitoring A/C for providing initial overseas requirements for this operation in accordance with the "Overseas Requisitioning Shipping Case and Item Control Procedures." SMMA will be the agency for preparing reports of water damage and will make necessary arrangements with the Naval Supply Center Pacific (NSCP) at Oakland, California, to obtain direct initial overseas shipping.
- b. When initial supply action for the overseas destination is desired, through the medium of a requisition, the Chief of Material of Task Group 132.4 will submit to SMMA, the following: (1) separate consolidated lists of requisitioning and/or property class, including nomenclature and stock number or technical order list, and by each technical order list for technical services items for each provisioned unit assigned in the Operation. Lists will be submitted to SMMA by operating letter in four copies or a request will be submitted for initial overseas supply tables by the E/A Section of Task Group 132.4 including complete shipping and marking instructions for separate requirements such as spares, communications equipment and/or special lists of miscellaneous supplies and/or equipment, and indicate the provisional unit for which the requirements are applicable.
- c. A separate overseas requisition number and/or AFSD number will be assigned to each consolidated list of equipment or supply table by SMMA. For each provisional unit. When a requirements list is submitted to SMMA, items will be screened for correctness of stock number, nomenclature, and/or substitutions. Immediately upon completion of screening action, SMMA will extract requests to appropriate Zonal Depots for supply action. Hq, A/C regulated items will be extracted to appropriate Hq, A/C property classes. SMMA will be responsible for initiating requisitions for Technical Service items through the appropriate AF Stock Control Depot.
- d. All items appearing on lists submitted by the E/A Section of Task Group 132.4 which cannot be identified or classified at SMMA will be omitted from the AF Supply Executive Summary and referred to the Port Logistical Officer, SMMA, McClellan AFB, Sacramento, California, who will be responsible for submitting requisitions in accordance with the appropriate procedure, for direct shipment to the overseas location, marking for the applicable provisional unit in order to complete the

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to be sent for that unit reaching the bulk of its supply by the action of an AF Supply Directive. The D/I Section of Task Group 132.4, while in the Zone of Interior, will requisition from SSMU through the Task Group 132.4 Port Logistical Officer any additional requisitions and direct shipment to the overseas location unless the limits of items is of considerable volume, in which case SSMU will publish an official AF Supply Directive and effect automatic action. Only items of considerable value including considerable volume of property will be referred to SSMU for the publishing of AF Supply Directives. Lists involving a minimum number of items (50 or less), will be requisitioned by the D/I Section of Task Group 132.4 on SSMU through the Task Group 132.4 Port Logistical Officer and shipped direct to the overseas location.

- c. All water shipments for JTF 132 will be directed to the Freight Terminal Department, (Approved and Liaison FTD), Naval Supply Center, Oakland, California. Explosives, small arms, GAO Units, etc., will be directed to Receiving Officer U.S. Naval Magazine, Port Chicago, California, Exp FTD, Naval Supply Center, Oakland California.
- f. Task Group 132.4 air shipments will be prepared for shipment to the Transportation Officer, SSMU, McCallum AFB, California who will obtain the air movement designation and release from the JTF 132 Liaison Officer, Travis AFB, California. When air shipments are ready for movement to SSMU, they will be forwarded without obtaining prior release from JTF 132 Liaison Officer, Travis AFB, California, or from Transportation Officer, SSMU. The Transportation Officer, SSMU, will upon receipt of shipments, furnish the JTF 132 Liaison Officer, Travis AFB, California, with the following information: type of material (general form), weight and cube, dimensions, and shipment identification, requisition number and AFSD number. AOCIP shipments will be handled in the same manner except that the Task Group 132.4 Port Logistical Officer at SSMU will be given advance notice of the shipment of AOCIP items.
- g. Overseas shipment control at SSMU will monitor all AF Supply Directives and control all additional requests for Operation "IVY" which are submitted by the D/I Section of Task Group 132.4 Port Logistical Officer, for shipment to the overseas account numbers while in the Zone of Interior. SSMU will also control all requisitions submitted to the Zone of Interior, by the property accountable Supply Officers at the overseas location.
- h. Mr. John Drenel has been designated project Officer for Operation "IVY" at SSMU and will be responsible for maintaining the complete status of all AF Supply Directives, requisitions submitted by the D/I Section of Task Group 132.4, and requisitions submitted by the property accountable Supply Officer at the overseas location in call coordination with the Liaison Officers at the Naval Supply Center and Travis AFB.

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- i. The Office of Special Distribution of Items (OSDI) and the Office of Special Distribution of Items (OSDI) will be responsible for the distribution of items to the 1st and 2nd Divisions of Task Group 132.4 at Khammoua AB and Hq 132, AFM: 132 11.
 - j. The covered bases, BHEAFON and HEMJALBIA, will upon receipt of initial requisitions for JIF 132, submit any additional requisitions for the support of this special operation, directly to ensure subject control at SMI, who will contact when necessary to the applicable Zonal Depot and/or Hq AIC or initiate local procurement in accordance with AFM 13-16 dated 25 August 1950.
 - k. Local Purchase Funds and Stock Fund clearing items appropriations will be furnished SMI by the Task Group 132.4 Post Logistical Office at SMI, which requisitioned and SMI is responsible for providing such information to suppliers.
 - l. All items coded LV will be locally manufactured by the appropriate Western Zonal Depot.
 - m. Hq AIC Priority S-2 is authorized Operation "IVY" at both 1st and 2nd Divisions of Task Group 132.4. All requests for materials for Operation "IVY" will contain a statement "Items are required for JIF 132 and Supply Priority S-2 is authorized per AFM 13-16". This statement is necessary to identify the requests for cost purposes and to insure priority handling.
 - n. In accordance with Hq USAF OPU-52 a precedence of VII-13 is established for Operation "IVY".
5. Within Hq AIC, Mr. Jerome Bergert, Office Symbol, HEMJALBIA, Phone Extension 67309, is designated AIC Supply Division project Officer for this Operation.

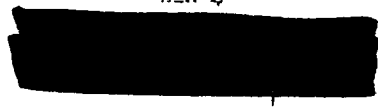
6. COMPLETION OF OPERATION "IVY"

1. In the implementation of Operation IVI, weather observation stations will be established at four (4) remote locations in the United States Pacific Trust Territories. These weather stations will be operated by detachments of the Weather Reporting Element of the Test Services Unit (Provisional) which will be manned by detachments of the 2069th Mobile Weather Squadron now at Tinker Air Force Base, Oklahoma. During the period of overseas operation these units will be under the jurisdiction of this Headquarters.
2. This operation will require a three (3) month level of supplies and necessary operating equipment to be delivered to the operating sites concurrently with the arrival of the detachments.
3. Plans for logistical support of these units contemplate, primarily the shipping of supplies and equipment from depot sources to Pearl Harbor, Territory of Hawaii, at which point the property will be received by the detachment commander and assembled for unit loading aboard an LST for transportation to Majuro, Ponape and Ruscio in custody of the respective detachment commanders. Supplies and equipment destined for Eilima will be shipped from depot sources to Eniwetok at which point the property will be received by the detachment commander and assembled for loading aboard the LST upon its arrival from Ponape, and transported to the operating site in custody of the detachment commander. Upon completion of operations these detachments will be picked up by LST and the property returned to Pearl Harbor in the custody of the detachments, at which time the excess property will be turned back into supply channels and the required equipment returned to Tinker Air Force Base by the detachments.
4. Consideration of time and economy of transportation includes the assembly of all required equipment and supplies at the port station, thus eliminating the usage of normal procedure prescribed for detached organizations in paragraph 56, Part III, AFM 67-1.

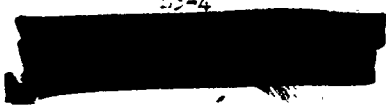

a. Address:

Incoming and outgoing personal telegrams will be addressed in the same manner as personal mail.

b. Handling:

(1) Personal telegrams originating from the outlying weather reporting stations will be sent by radio to Commanding Officer, TD 132.4.3.2, Headquarters, TD 132.4.3.2 will prepare and deliver the message to the appropriate agency for transmission.

(2) Personal telegrams originating on BIKINI or KWAJALEIN will be delivered to the appropriate agency for transmission by the individual concerned.

3. POST EXCHANGE SERVICE:

Adequate exchange service will be available to Air Force Personnel at BIKINI and KWAJALEIN. It will be the responsibility of each individual on the Weather Reporting Islands to maintain his own stock of exchange items. This will be accomplished by requesting the desired items be delivered with the resupply trips from KWAJALEIN.

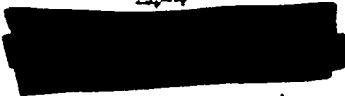

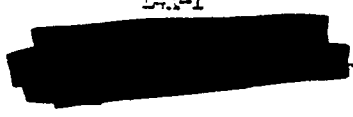

My Dear General:

Reference is made to your letter dated May 26, 1952, addressed to the High Commissioner relative to providing for such support as may be required in the establishment of weather reporting facilities at Hilo, Hana, Maui, and Kahala.

It is our understanding that Colonel Barney has been apprised of the fact that the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands has no facilities at points other than Hilo and Hana. The Trust Territory operates small hotels and messes at these points and is equipped to provide the other services and labor which you detailed in the attachment to your letter.

As to the method of payment, the personnel assigned to your project may --

- (1) pay for hotel accommodations and meals as well as laundry, medical and dental services and be reimbursed by their own agency, or
- (2) if you consider it more convenient, such services will be billed to you directly from the headquarters office in Honolulu on Standard Form 1000.

It is not considered necessary to enter into a formal contract for the services which you may require. For your information the District Administrators at Hilo and Hana are being informed that they are to furnish every assistance which you may require and to cooperate with your representative to the fullest extent.

Personnel authorized emergency leaves will be placed on Task Group 132.4 orders to CG, AFPAS, Travis Air Force Base, who will indorse leave orders. Personnel released from duty with Headquarters, Task Group 132.4, other than for inefficiency or disciplinary reasons, may be granted no more than 15 days leave of absence, if accrued, enroute to their stations of permanent assignment. 12. MEDICAL:

13. PRISONERS:

In the event it is necessary to imprison any of the personnel on the outlying islands, the Detachment Commander will advise the Commanding Officer TE 132.4.3.2 by radio. The arrangements to pick-up and remove the prisoner will be made by Commanding Officer, TE 132.4.3.2.

14. UNIFORM:

Personnel will wear the uniform prescribed by Commander, Task Group 132.4.

15. PERSONAL AFFAIRS:

- a. The Personal Affairs Program will be administered by TE 132.4.3.2.
- b. The Commanding Officer, TE 132.4.3.2 will insure that all personnel have their personal affairs in proper order prior to departure for the forward area.
- c. Living expense in the forward area will be negligible; therefore, substantial allotments to insure adequate maintenance of dependents should be executed. This is particularly true for personnel at the outlying islands where it will be difficult for a man to forward funds to his dependents in case of an emergency.

17. CASUALTY REPORTING:

Detachment Commanders will render casualty reports in accordance with Air Force Regulation 30-11, 25 January 1952, and Air Force Regulation 35-67, 12 December 1951, to Commanding Officer TE 132.4.3.2. Commanding Officer TE 132.4.3.2 will forward the report to Commander, Task Group 132.4. Special instructions and the handling of the remains are given in paragraphs 22b and c, Appendix 3, Annex "C", Operations Plan 1-52, Headquarters, Task Group 132.4.

18. PREPARATION FOR OVERSEAS MOVEMENT (POM):

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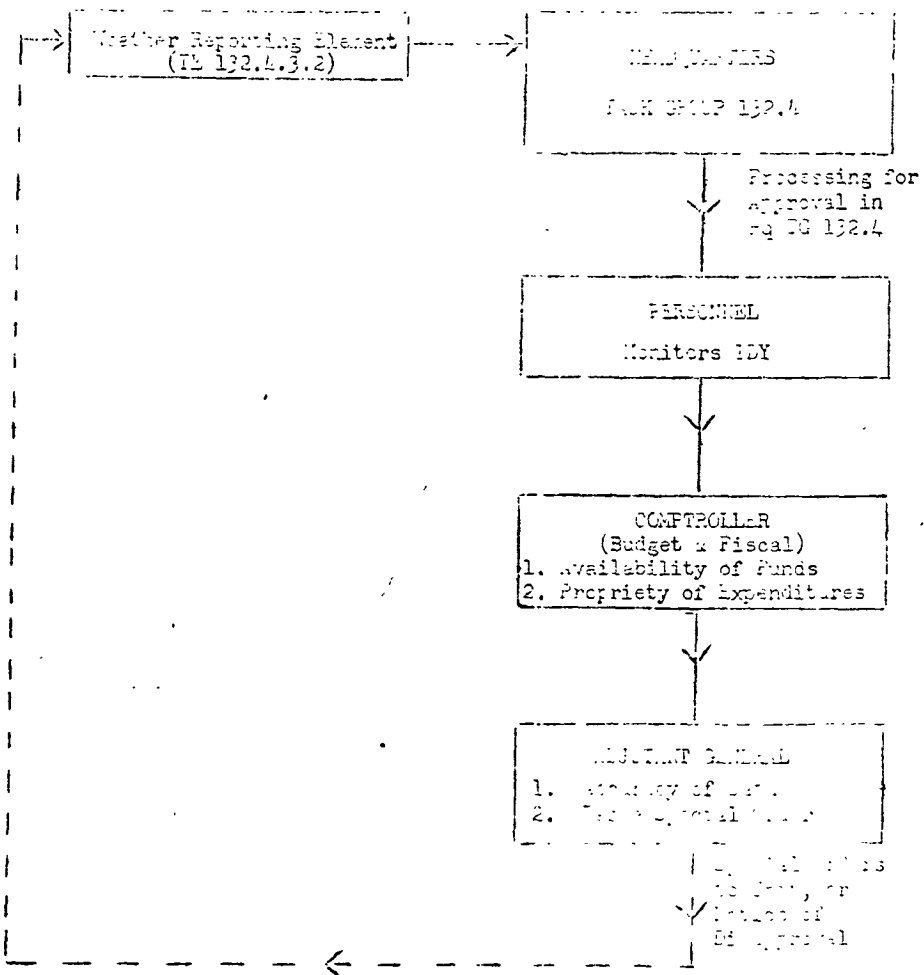

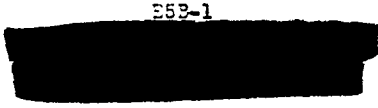

SPECIAL PREPARATION FOR OVERSEAS ASSIGNMENT REQUIREMENTS

1. PHYSICAL EXAMINATIONS:

a. A physical examination will be given all personnel within 48 hours of departure from their home stations and within 12 hours before departing the Territory of Hawaii if the flying unit duty in Hawaii is greater than 48 hours, to detect any communicable disease. Personnel found to have a communicable disease will not depart the Territory of Hawaii until free of the disease. If a communicable disease is detected prior to departing Hawaii the Commanding Officer IE 182.4.3.2 will be notified by priority message as to the name, rank and AFSC of the person being detained so a replacement can be made. A report in the form of a medical certificate will be furnished the Commanding Officer IE 182.4.3.2 by the Medical Officer or Medical Technician making the examination.

(1) The Aero Medical Supervisor in each detachment may be utilized in making the examination if a Medical Officer is not readily available.

b. Complete physical examination will be accomplished only in those individual cases in which the record of performance of duty is such as to indicate apparent disqualifying condition which was developed since last determination of physical examination, or in those specific cases in which a Medical Officer deems such examination is required.

c. Complete physical examinations of personnel requiring examination in accordance with paragraph 1b above will be accomplished promptly upon determination that such examination is required. Disposition of physically or mentally unfit personnel will be made in accordance with current service directives.

d. An annual physical examination will be accomplished on all flying personnel if their date of departure is within sixty (60) days of their birth date. This will be a flying type physical.

e. An annual physical examination will be accomplished on all officers and airmen whose date of departure is within sixty (60) days of their birth date and who will have attained at the same time, the age of forty or above. A routine check-up will be accomplished on all these persons as a part of their flight, health,

f. Dental check and dental work will be completed before departure from home station.

g. In general, persons considered physically qualified for duty in the United States are qualified for overseas assignment.

Immunizations for Yellow Fever, Typhus, Cholera and Dysentery Immunizations have been ordered for this mission. All personnel will be required to have complete immunization or stimulating doses against Cholera, Typhoid Fever and Tetanus, as shown below:

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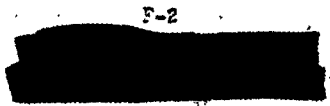
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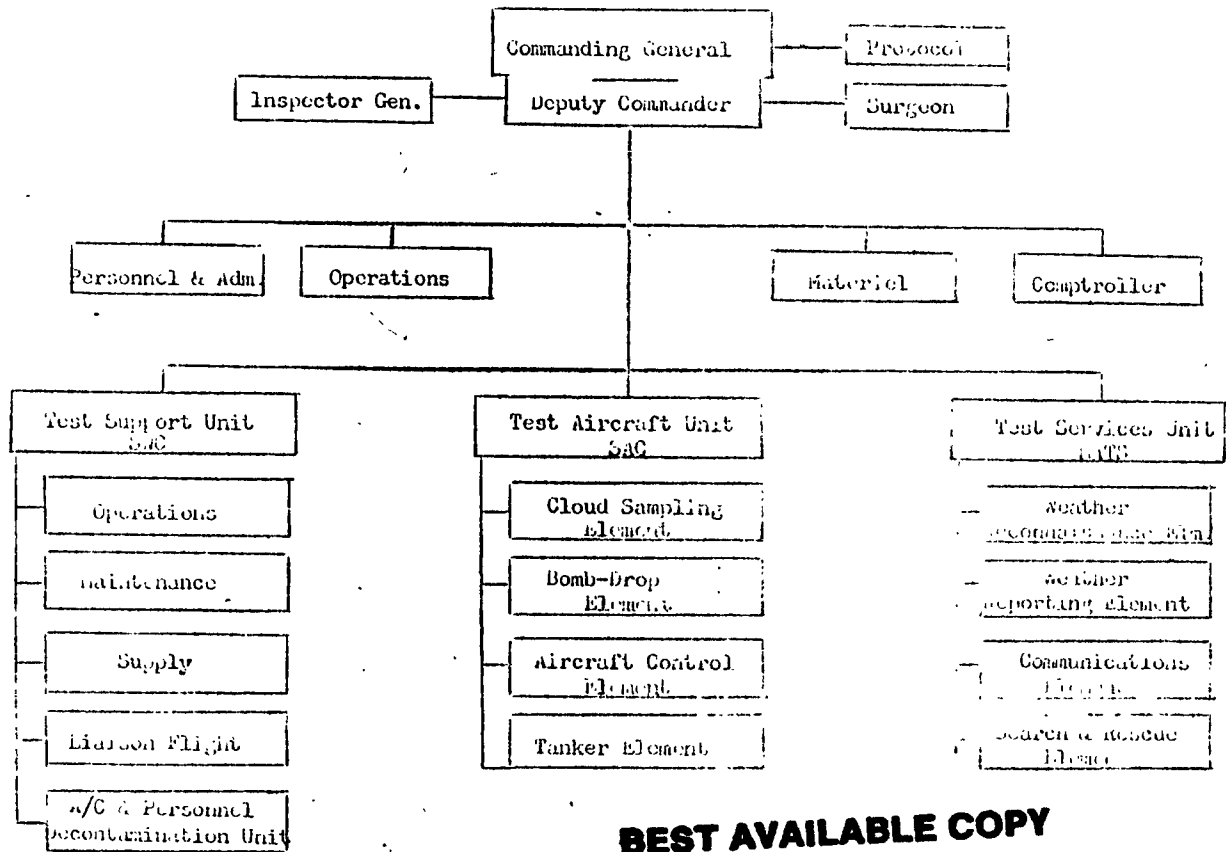
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ORGANIZATION OF TASK GROUP 132.4

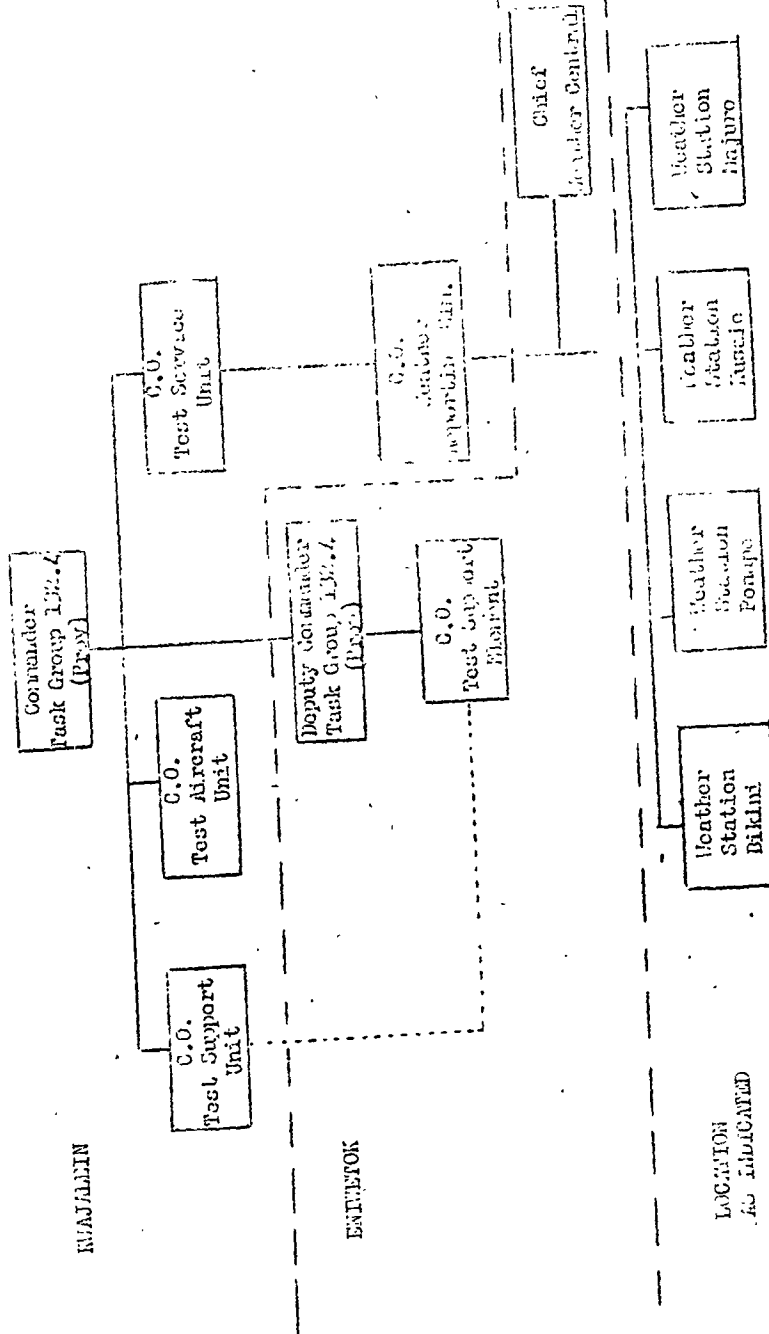

1. GENERAL:

TE 132.4.3.2 will accomplish the training required herein as a minimum towards successful completion of the TE 130.4.3.2 mission.

2. UNIT TRAINING:

a. Detachment Commanders will be responsible that their unit is properly trained with all individuals skilled to accomplish tasks as listed in the Basic Operations Order. Training will be accomplished under the control of the Commanding Officer, 5th Training Squadron, during the training phase and under the control of the Commanding Officer, TE 132.4.3.2 during the operational phase.
