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Dear Dr. Pearson:

I am pleased to present a short statement on the progress of the report on the classification of the living fishes.

We have finished collecting the 215 plates, 71 plates, and 22 specimen boxes which we expect to consist of about 800 mounted specimens. We expect to have proofs back from the AEC in January.

This morning I talked with our Associate Editor, John Lea, who stated that the Smithsonian Institution intends to order from the government printing office, only 200 copies, which would cover only this one classification needs. I was sorry to learn from the associate editor that so few copies were being printed and in my opinion this is far beneath to cover the needs of other government agencies. If you are interested in obtaining copies for the AEC, I suggest that an order be placed along with that of the Smithsonian Institution. The estimated cost can easily be doubled between 2.00 and 3.00.

The plates and drawings have come out very nicely and I am convinced that this contribution on the fishes of the world will remain as always played a great importance to those who work with that fauna in the years to come.
