

Dear Dr. Fearson:

Under separate cover, we are forwarding to you two copies of <u>UNFL</u> Report 22, "Suggestion For a Program of Radiological Resurvey of the Bikini-Eniwetok area During July and August of 1950." We realize this outline of proposed work is more of a schedule than a discussion of the problems to be investigated.

It is noped that the conference between Dr. Tuttle and members of our staff will be helpful in developing the various points that may not be clear in the outline as forwarded to you.

Our thoughts regarding this summer's expedition at Eniwetok are twofold: (1) to gather as much information as possible on delayed effects of the 1948 tests, and (2) to get specific locations of populations of individual plants and animals located for observation immediately following the contemplated series of tests.

All the data on the 1949 expedition has been gathered and is now being assembled in the final report. We hope to have this in your hands in a few days.
