Dear Mr. LeBaron:

Reference is made to our letter of January 22, 1953 which outlined the CASTLE operation as we conceive it at the present time. At this stage, I trust that there are some minor changes in our conception of tests at the Nevada Proving Grounds. In particular, the number of shots should be increased in the interest of economy in the resolution of factors bearing on energy existing weapons and special atomic requirements. At this stage, we believe a program of six shots would assist materially in the above, and, accordingly, we have been working with Joint Task Force Seven on questions of the feasibility of such a program. From their standpoint, and ours, it appears practicable to execute a six shot program and to negotiate the proposed timing of CASTLE, provided the Atomic Energy Commission and the Department of Defense accept such a program and provided the various contributing phases such as special materials production at Oak Ridge remain on schedule.

Briefly stated, the program now being developed contemplates six shots: four shots University and two shots Los Alamos Scientific Laboratory and two shots Doe.

At the University, the first shot will be conducted at the University of California Radiation Laboratory and the second at the University of California Radiation Laboratory at Los Alamos, New Mexico. The first detonation is scheduled for February 15, 1953, with seven to ten days interval between shots.

It should be emphasized, however, that the actual scope and plan for execution of CASTLE cannot be fully determined at this time. At that time the relevant factors bearing on the number of the various proposals and on the operational capabilities and limitations both of material production and of a Task Force nature will be more complete. We hope crystallization of these factors will be sufficient at that time to enable us to reach agreement on the specific scope for CASTLE.
