MEDICAL SURVEILLANCE OF BIKINI WORKERS.

WHILE I WAS AT MAJURO LAST WEEK, THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY ASKED TO DISCUSS THE SUBJECT OF NON-BIKINIANS WHO HAVE LIVED AND WORKED ON BIKINI - SOME FOR SEVERAL YEARS. THESE MEN, WHO HAVE BEEN EMPLOYED BY THE DISTRICT (AS AGRICULTURISTS, FOR EXAMPLE) WILL NO LONGER HAVE EMPLOYMENT AFTER THE BIKINI EXODUS AND THUS WILL RETURN TO THEIR HOME ATOLLS. THEY ANTICIPATE THAT THERE WILL BE SOME MEDICAL FOLLOW-UPS OF THE BIKINIANS AND WONDER IF THEY WILL BE INCLUDED.

PEOPLE HAS NOT YET BEEN DESIGNED IN DETAIL BUT THAT IT IS CONSIDERED

I REPEATED WHAT I HAD EARLIER SAID TO JIM WINN, I.E. WE DO NOT

FOLLOW-UP SURVEILLANCE OF BIKINIANS HAS NOT YET BEEN PLANNED IN DE-
TAIL, BUT WHATEVER PROGRAM IS ADOPTED I AM SURE THAT ALL PEOPLE WHO
HAVE RESIDED ON BIKINI WILL BE CONSIDERED EQUALLY.

AND EXPECT TO BE NOTIFIED OF THE PLANS. I ANSWERED YES, AND THAT WE
WOULD WORK THROUGH THE DISTRICT ADMINISTRATOR TO KEEP IN TOUCH WITH
THEM. HE EMPHASIZED THAT HE WOULD LIKE ANOTHER MEETING AS SOON AS
OUR PLANS ARE KNOWN.

JUST AS WE HAVE ANTICIPATED, I SEE EMERGING AN EXPECTATION OF IN-
CREASING AND CONTINUING HEALTH CARE DEPENDENCE UPON DOE. I WOULD
ANTICIPATE THAT THE IN-VIVO COUNTING AT KWAJALEIN WILL LIKELY RE-
INFORCE THIS EXPECTATION. I THINK IT WILL BE VIEWED AS SOMEHOW
BENEFICIAL TO THOSE COUNTED, AND THUS SOMETHING TO BE DESIRED.
