The medical exeminations of the Rongelap and Utivik papple were successfully completed. We find it necessary to bring three new thymoid cases to the U.S. for further examinations and possible surgery; one in the Rongelap exposed group and two in the Utimik emposed group. There were no other findings of significance (except one case refigmed to below) and the peoples' health seemed generally good. The three cancer cases from Rongelap were brought to Tripler for examinations and we were glad that ofter special thyroid examinations there was no evidence of conterremaining. However, a small growth was discovered in Ellon Doas in the region of the pituitary gland. Since she wanted to be with her daughter, Ermita for birth of her child, we could not carry out further exact entire then but it is very important that she get specialized examinations in the U.S. and she has agreed to return-possibly with the three thyroid cases. I mention this to you to ask your help in case she should not fully appreciate the importance of further examinations. When we brought the three ladies to Tripler there was a regretful delay in getting them admitted to the hospital. It seems that a certain paper was not given to us for entrance into the U.S. and immigration held us up a long bira and them in spite of careful preparations for admission to the hospital there was a delay in getting them admitted. I was most sormy for this and know the ladies were rightfully upset. I was glad we had languished Jacob and Aejon Time from Rongelep on hand at the hospital to be with them a good bit of the time.

During our visits to Utirik and Rongelap it was apparent that theve was considerable confusion about those eligible for benefits of Reblic Law 5-52. At Utirik the unexposed people thought that they should be entitled to I.D. Cards and at Rongelap they wanted all the children included. The law and the agreement between ERDA and T.T. states that only the people on our examination list (a copy of which is kept at Majuro) are entitled. This includes exposed Rongelap and Utirik people and the special unexposed Rongelap group of 150 people. Therefore, no unexposed Utirik, only some of the unexposed Rengelap and no children are included. We attempted to explain this and also that: the unexposed Rongelap control group was established many years ago (1957) and the people on this list were selected to match for age and sex people in the exposed Rongelap group. This group is considered quite adequate for both exposed groups and it has not been considered necessary to have unemposed Utivik people as controls. It should be mentioned, however, that all of those people have the benefit of general medical c re at



sich call when our decrees one on the felunds. With regard to the control group it is my exdension that the Congress of Micronesia in-cluded this group for behalite on on indicement for and compensation for participation in the ensect examinations.

Another missomosphion is only the people was that the slight residual contamination on Respeise was the cause of the New thyroid nedules noted in the unemposed Rengalap people (setably more nodules occurred in the unemposed Rengalap people not living on Rengelap). Attempts were unde to emploin that the modelections ("thyroid poison"), that caused the thyroid nodules in the Rengelap people was gone (field out) by 2-3 weeks and so there was none of this "thyroid poison" left han the unemposed people moved those. The level of other radiolectopes which are not selectively absorbed by the chyroid (as is radiolectopes which are not selectively obsorbed by the chyroid (as is radiolected) has been far too low to be of consequence in this regard.

It was a pleasure having John Hagielgom with us end I am sure he has a much better insight late these problems as a result. He indicated that you may visit the outer islands soon. If so, I hope you will be able to help clarify some of the unsumbustandings. I am admid some of the people are blaming our medical team for the stipulations of the law and agreement. It was a pleasure useing you in Kanjalein.
