MKETING WITH HIGH COMMISSIONER, TRUST TERRITORY, PACIFIC II

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A most informative and productive meeting was held at 10 o'clock on 27 June with Mr. Edward B. Johnston, High Counterioner, Trust Territory- Pacific, and members of the Honoldy Area Office, Holmes & Harver, Inc., and Joint Tesk Force Hight. The first item discussed was the High Commissioner's schedule of events for the next few months. He will depart Honolul Sunday, 19 June, wie Johnston Island for in the Trust Territory west battle the end of September. Sainen where he will remain for Colonel McPhes, CJTG 8.4, Johnson Island, will be slorted to meet Commissioner im appropriate lunesus tour of the facilitains at the I.L. complete

In reference to Admiral Mustin's request to meet with the High Countesioner on 18 August, Commissioner Johnston informed Mr. Boumet that date appeared responsible at this time and he desired to meet with the party at Eurislein rather then Honolulu. BEST COPY AVAILABLE

The major part of the meeting began at 10:10 A.M. with Mesers. Bonnet and Hills and Colonel Schott of MAD: Jim Johnson of Ham: Colonel Marton of JTF-8; and High Commissioner Johnston of the Trust Territory Pecific present. Covered generally for Commissioner Johnston's information were the history and background of what DASA, JTF-8 and ABC are and what they do. Viewgraphs were shown of the management, functions, and locations of MAO (JTG 8.5) and their association with DASA, ABC, and JTT-8.

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In general, the area history, planning, deployment and present elemap status of Bikini were given. Specifically addressed were the number of people involved, the logistic support and equipment needs. Commissioner Johnston quaried the group as to any native problems that have arisen since their strivel. The answer was an unequivical "no"; with the encopeien of additional many required to pay the nectives eventure. Commissioner Johnston was provided an estimated data for completion of elemap as I September with two additional weeks required for rollup procedures. He was also shown and provided appropriate copies of messages dealing with the problem of equipment retention and transfer.

The problem of a full time Trust Territory representative at Bikini was discussed and Commissioner Johnston agreed that one should be there on a full time basis and indicated he would enumine the problem when he arrives at Saipan. He asked whether there was a complete list of equipment now on Bikini which he could review and from which he could pick equipment. The server was "no" and it was recommended that a consolidated list he preserved of both ABC and BCD equipment.

The question of qualified equipment operators and maintenance people: who also discussed. He said the Trust Territory did have qualified personnel to operate and maintain similar type equipment to that on Rikini. He agreed whole heartedly there was no sense in leaving any type equipment on Rikini that could not be operated from maintained. He suggested Hr. Dright Meine, (Discusse-Administrator, Magnettanacionde) now employed by the Trust Territory was the best men to handle this situation.

Goomissioner Johnston said there were indications of mative unrest within the Marshalle and Mr. Heine is the type of men who travels the islands in an actumpt to settle the unrest.

Mr. Bonnet mentioned Dr. Robert Conard of Brookhaven Metional Laboratory and his function of monitoring the health of the natives on Rongeley and Utivik and his

plument to set up a similar facility at Mikini to monitor the health of the matives in that area.

A question concerning the need for continuing support by Hill as a contractor was discussed and whether the use of this contractor was desired for agricultural planting and economic development of this island area; if so, advance notice would be required as soon as possible prior to the termination of the classus operation now / under way. Jim Johnson of Hill advised that the magnitude of the job to be done in agriculture planting was frightening in view of the equipment with which the Trust Tarritory had to use. Hill through the ABC is quite willing to help train and assist in any way if approved.

Conserving the economic development of the Trust Territory, Commissioner Johnston mintioned that Dr. Gook of MIT is now studying all aspects of what had to be done including the money and logistics to complete such operations.

The continued used of the six strip on Bayu was discussed. Commissioner Johnston agreed that the present facilities unintained for air operation would be required. He had on hand a study by Hajor Headerson of the CBS on all types of air support and equipment required to support such economic development in the Pacific area. This is not for Bikini specifically, but for all Micronegia.

Jim Johnson of Hill addressed the fact that perhaps there might be an underron in the budget of \$1.3 million for Bikini Cleanup and that perhaps some of this underron sould be used for further venevation or continued maintenance of the sir strip at Enyu prior to departure. The group devoted that Authority for use of this money for other than actual cleanup would have to come from the Department of Interior after 1 July 1969, since the responsibility for this underron would be that of the Department of the Interior after 1 July.

In summary there were three major eress discussed and agreed upon as being anyone

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areas in which immediate serior would be required. They were:

- 1. The Bikini Cleanup effort within the present scope of work as defined in the Memo of Understanding between GJTG 8.8, the ABC Depety, Joseph M. Herrill, and Dr. Jack Tobin of the Trust Territory would be the basis of fulfilling the ABC and DCD obligations unless we hear differently from the Trust Territory.
- 2. A Trust Territory representative will be present on a full time basis.
- 3. A fully comprehensive and complete list of equipment required will be resolved in the near future by representatives of the AEC, DCD and Trust Territory. The final resolution as to how this equipment will be transferred (at no cost, total reimburgement, or transportation of replecement items) is still pending at the Mashington level.
