ACCORDING TO THE NAGASAKI ATOMIC BOMB HOSPITAL AND  
MR. SHIGETOSHI IWAMATSU, PROFESSOR OF THE NAGASAKI  
UNIVERSITY ALSO SECRETARY GENERAL OF NAGASAKI PREFECTURAL  
PEOPLE'S COUNCIL OF ALL JAPAN NATIONAL PEOPLE'S ANTI ATOMIC  
AND HYDROGEN BOMB COUNCIL, BOTH [REDACTED] AND [REDACTED]  
[REDACTED] WERE HOSPITALIZED AT THE NAGASAKI ATOMIC BOMB  
HOSPITAL ON AUGUST 4, 1980, FOR DETAILED MEDICAL  
EXAMINATION, AND LEFT THE HOSPITAL ON AUGUST 11, 1980.  
ALL EXPENSES WERE PAID BY THE ALL-KYUSHU PEOPLE'S  
ANTI-ATOMIC AND HYDROGEN BOMB COUNCIL. RESULT OF THE  
EXAMINATION SHOWS NO IMMEDIATE HOSPITALIZATION IS NEEDED  
BUT FURTHER OBSERVATION WAS RECOMMENDED FOR CARDIAC PROBLEMS  
IN BOTH MEN. IN NEITHER CASE DID THE DOCTORS CONSIDER THE  
PROBLEMS SERIOUS. THERE WAS NO INDICATION OF RADIATION-  
RELATED ILLNESS. ALTHOUGH EXAMINING PHYSICIAN HOPED BOTH  
OF THEM COULD STAY IN JAPAN TO HAVE FURTHER MEDICAL  
EXAMINATION, APPARENTLY THEY HAD TO LEAVE JAPAN BECAUSE  
LACK OF FUNDS.
