MEMORANDUM
AGREEMENT

 11 *MEMORANDUM*
 12 This agreement expresses an understanding reached on this
 13 day between counsel for plaintiffs and counsel for defendants
 14 in the above-entitled action with regard to the establishment
 15 and operation of a medical panel which will plan and oversee
 16 all aspects of medical/radiological examinations which will be
 17 conducted on all those Bikinians, now residing on Bikini Island
 18 or formerly residing there within the past ten (10) years, and
 19 desiring examination:

20 1. On or before November 24, 1975, plaintiffs will send a
 21 letter to John deYoung and all counsel of record, setting forth
 22 a list of names of scientists and/or medical doctors acceptable
 23 to plaintiffs to serve on the panel. The list will also in-
 24 clude, as to each candidate, a description of his title, ex-
 25 perience, residence, etc.

26 2. On or before December 22, 1975, defendants will send a
 27 letter to plaintiffs which will either accept or reject plain-
 28 tiffs' list:

29 A. If defendants accept plaintiffs' list, defendants,
 30 in their December 22 letter, will additionally select three (3)
 31 individuals from plaintiffs' list to serve on the panel. In the
 32 event that one or more of the named individuals is unable to
 serve on the panel, defendants, in their letter, will also

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1 select three (3) alternative individuals, in order of
2 preference, to serve on the panel.

3 B. If defendants reject plaintiffs' list, their
4 December 22 letter will indicate which, if any, of those
5 persons named by plaintiffs are acceptable and will also
6 provide a list of additional names of individuals acceptable
7 to them to serve on the panel.

8 3. If defendants comply with paragraph 2-A, supra, they
9 will supply to the panel on or before January 5, 1976, a
10 factual report containing, but not limited to, a descript
11 of the medical facilities and equipment on Majuro, ^{available} a background
12 history of the individual Bikinians, all prior scientific
13 and/or medical surveys or reports on Bikini or its people, and
14 proposed general budgetary guidelines of the medical examination
15 program.

16 4. If defendants comply with paragraph 2-B, supra, plaintiffs
17 and defendants will negotiate as soon as possible to
18 reach a decision as to the membership of the panel. Within two
19 (2) weeks of this agreement, defendants will supply to the panel
20 the report described in paragraph 3, supra.

21 5. After studying defendants' report, the panel will issue
22 its recommendations describing the nature, content and scope of
23 the medical examination to be conducted. These recommendations
24 will be subject to the approval of all parties.

25 6. None of the panel members or alternates will be individ-
26 uals associated with the Department of the Interior, the
27 Department of Defense, or the Energy Research and Development
28 Administration.

29 7. It is the strong wish of the plaintiffs that at least
30 one member of the panel will not be an employee of the United
31 States Government.
