We were glad that Dr. Tolbert could visit with you when he was on the west coast last month. We appreciate the fact that you are anxious to know whether or not there are any plans for a survey party at Eniwetok and Bikini this summer.

Due to the rather tight schedule that the Navy has for projects directly concerned with defense it does not appear feasible for a survey party to visit these areas this summer. Dr. Shields Warren has discussed this with the Navy and this is a pretty firm decision.

We would assume, now that you are in the new laboratory, that you would develop a program there. We anticipate that there are ample problems in aquatic biology that would be of mutual interest to the A.E.C. and to the Applied Fisheries Laboratory to warrant developing a program there within the confines of the present budget.

This work would undoubtedly supplement the work that Dr. Foster is doing at Hanford. The genetic phases have been reviewed with you by Drs. Stern and Zelle and the problems here are fairly clear.

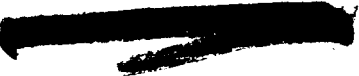
