Dear Dr. Tolbert:

I regret that I addressed my recent letter concerning operations greenhouse to your brother instead of to you but Dr. Brandt's secretary apparently slipped up.

The reason for my request for plant material showing morphological aberrations are three-fold:

(1) They have previously been reported from Bikini, Eniwetok and Likiep Atolls - reference:

> UWEL-23, Section V - RADIOBIOLOGICAL SURVEY OF BIKINI, ENIWETOK, AND LIKIEP ATOLS -JULY-AUGUST 1949 by Applied Fisheries Laboratory University of Washington

- (2) We have produced various kinds of aberrations experimentally here with both chronic and acute radiation.
- (3) They have been elsewhere reported in the literature.

Specifically you might be on the lookout for (1) tumor-like masses with varying degrees of differentiation, (2) dense clusters of vegetative or floral shoots (they may also be deformed), (3) color changes in vegetative or floral parts. Items (1) and (2) are the most interesting to us. If any of the above are observed, I would appreciate some specimens fixed if possible, or dry specimens are better than none. If neither of these are practical, photographs would be useful. The name of the plants showing the aberrations would be helpful in any case.
