In discussing things a little longer here I find that I made a misstatement at your conference. In the last discussion I stated that in a certain event there is a good chance that some of the radioactivity will leave the earth's atmosphere and will be just blown away from the planet. I am now convinced that such a possibility will not arise on any important scale. It is true, however, that in the type of explosion which we have discussed the radioactivity will be blown up into the very high levels of the stratosphere.
