Dear Lev. Burrie:

In view of the responsibilities of the U. A. Atomic Marry Countssion for the conduct of atomic tests, and the interest of the Division of Biology and Medicine in matters relating to civilian defense, President Risembower has referred your letter of April 10, 1953 to this office.

We were pleased to receive your suggestion that ministers of the smaller congregations throughout the United States he allowed to witness an atomic test in order better to aid in the dissemination of the message of civilian defense. Understoodly, as your letter suggests, a certain amount of completency has had to be evertone in organizing for civil defense. The fact that progress has been made and that those attitudes have to some extent been evertone is in no small part due to the farsightedness of responsible groups such as years.

The storic tests in Nevada and in the Pacific are primarily for the purpose of facilitating our weapons development program. However, the Commissions fully appreciates the fact that eye-witness accounts of atomic detenations are convincing reminders of the need for alart and informed civilian defense organisations. Accordingly, the ANC has ecoperated with the Federal Civil Befonse Administration in arranging for observers from state and local civil defense organisations to witness, on two occasions, test detenations and to participate in simulated disaster exercises. But as you can appreciate, security and safety considerations have made it commission that such attendance be kept to a small and manageable number.

We feel that the FCAA is in a much better position, by virtue of their direct responsibility for civil defense, to recognise representative civil groups and to evaluate the need for their mitnessing atomic detonations. We would suggest, therefore, that you contact the FCCA. We are certain that Kr. Val Petersen, Administrator, would be placased to hear from you and would carefully consider your suggestions.
