A letter sent to General Senter on 22 April 1953 by Dr. John C. Bugher, Division of Biology and Medicine of the AEC outlines the objectives of Project Gabriel (SECRET), and the need for an advisory and consultant group to direct an intensive program for studying meteorological influences controlling fallout of bomb debris, the uptake of fission products by plants and animals, and the ultimate degree of hazard which may be occasioned by such materials.
