Rad-Safe Requirements - Elmer & Tare

May 7, 1953

The following statement of the above requirement is quoted from Mr. J. L. Shumway's letter J-17522 dated April 28, 1953, which was approved for construction by Mr. P. W. Spain's letter PG-2-2078 of May 1, 1953:

"Task Unit - 7. Rad Safe, has the following requirements for the coming operation:

- 1. 75 x 100' fenced area, wire fence 3' high, in the field North of the Rad Safe Building, Building 323, Site Elmer, for contaminated storage and decontamination area. Fence to have a 14 wide opening in the side next to Building 323.
- 2. Two tents, eight-man sixe, adjacent to the decking area Site Tare, one tent for control and one for supply issue. Outdoor shower facilities for personnel decontamination will be required near the tents.
- 3. Adjacent to the tents on Bits Tare is to be a fenced area similar to the one to be provided on Site Elmer,

In his approval, Mr. Spain indicated that a three strand barbed wire fence was considered sufficient.

Home Office Engineering will write an A.M.E. for the barbed wire, and it is requested that Jobsite Engineering prepare location drawings at both sites for fencing, tents and other facilities.

Your attention is called to SK-10+ showing the approved extension of Building 323.
