DETAILED DESCRIPTION: This station is located approximately 105 feet north of the high tide line on the lagoon side and 420 feet west of the east end of the island.

This station is R.M. No. 1 of Triangulation Station Boga (see Horizontal Control Report 1949-50).

The station mark is a standard Holmes and Narver bronze disc stamped "P.I. 1" set in concrete flush with the surface.

P.I. "C" is a standard Holmes and Narver bronze disc stamped "P.I. "C" set in concrete 12" below the surface.

P.I. "1-A" is a 12" x 12" mark.

Station 300 is a 12 ft. square blockhouse whose W.P. (working point) is a cross cut in the roof slab on the northeast to southwest centerline and 5 ft. from the northeast face.
