MEMORANDUM FOR:

Thank you for your letter of December 16th which I have read with interest.

I am afraid I did not express myself clearly enough in the proposal I made to Mr. C. D. Jackson. I don't want to translate the President's proposal into exact units for specific countries. What I do want to do is to indicate to all countries where we have programs what this proposal could mean to them at some future date.

Actually all we need to have is the material referred to in the top paragraph of page 2 of your own letter.

Furthermore, what I want to do is to draw up, as far as possible, country papers which will give our Public Affairs Officer in each country such information as:

- 1) What hospitals in that country are now receiving isotopes from the United States, Britain or Canada?
- 2) What agricultural or industrial organizations or units in that country are now benefiting from atomic application?
- 3) What scientists from that country have participated in the development of atomic energy?
- 4) What scientists from that country have come to the United States to study the peaceful application of atomic energy?
- 5) Anything else you might suggest along this line.

I think our Public Affairs Officers have sufficient savvy to be able to utilize such information without creating any of the difficulties mentioned in your memorandum. A classified telegram in from a certain

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country today has a sentence which is most apropos to this discussion. It said that the public reaction to the President's proposal had been negative because the subject was too technical. The fact is that the subject is not too technical. In fact very few subjects are too technical. It is the explanation that is too technical. What we have got to do in our foreign information program is to explain this proposal and to make clear to the peoples overseas in terms that they can understand what this proposal could well mean to them.

I know I shall have the assistance of you and your assistants in working along this line, and I am most grateful to you for the warm cooperation you have given already.

The briefing this afternoon was eminently helpful. Many thanks for setting it up.
