1. Measures to Prevent Further Disclosures Concerning Operation IVY

Mr. Salisbury described the status of action to prevent further disclosures concerning Operation IVY and discussed with the Commission additional steps that might be taken to that end.


2. Continued Planning for Report to the Joint Committee on AEC Contract Policy (See General Manager's Memorandum of September 18 on this subject.)

Mr. Zuckert said that a task force consisting of the Policy Analysis Staff and other staff members had been formed to conduct the study and prepare the report on AEC contractor relationships requested by the Joint Committee. A charter defining the general objectives of the task force has been prepared. Mr. George Burgess has agreed to serve as over-all consultant to the task force and formulation of plans for the study is continuing.
