In accordance with our recent conversation, I am forwarding for Commission consideration a request made by Mr. Robert LeBaron, Chairman, Military Liaison Committee, for clearance of the following persons:

Millard F. Caldwell	Administrator	Civil Defense Adm.
Joseph C. O'Mahoney	Senator	Senate Appropriations
Robert L. F. Sikes	Representative	Appropriations

As you know, Mr. Caldwell was granted a Commission "Q" clearance on March 6, 1951; therefore, he will not require special clearance for this particular trip.

This office was informed on March 26, 1951, by Mr. LeBaron's office that Senator O'Mahoney would be unable to make the trip and would not require any special clearance. On March 27, 1951, Mr. LeBaron's office notified us that Senator John L. McClellan will go in Senator O'Mahoney's place.

It is requested that Representative Robert L. F. Sikes and Senator John L. McClellan be granted special Commission clearance for the express purpose of attending Operation GREENHOUSE as official observers. This office will note in its files that said clearances are limited only to such access as required in the capacity of official observer of Operation GREENHOUSE.
