U. S. FROGRAM OF ATOMIC WEAPONS

TESTS SUCCESSFUJITY CARRIED OU'C

The Atomic Fnorgy Conmission and the Department of Defense today notified President Truman that a program of atomic weapons tests has been successfully carried out by Joint Task Force 3 at the Commission's Proving Ground at Enjwetok Atoll.

Lieutenant General Elwood R. Quesada, USAF, commands JTF-3, composed of personnel from the AEC, Army, Navy, Air Force and from educational and industrial organizations. Dr. Alvin C. Graves of the Jos Alamos Scientific Laboratory is Scientific Deputy Commander of JTF-3.

As previously announced, test activjties at Eniwetok are under security restrictions including those of the Atomic Energy Act. Information obtained from research on malear detonations, the major purpose of the tests, is secret. In furtherance of the President's anrouncement of January 3l, 1950, the test program included experiments contributing to thermonuclear weapons research.

Information on several projectis in fields of Bjology, Modjcine and Radiology will be declassified and providod to appropriate agencies of the Government when results have been analyzed and evaluated. The program also included comprehensive measurement of blast and themal effects on structures, aircraft and varlous other items. Much of this data will be doclassified for use by both the Department of Defense and the Federal Civil Defense Agency. The data obtained include additional information of primary military value in the field of weapons effects.

General Quesada and Dr. Graves will return to Washington in a few wecks to report to the Departhent of Defense and AEC. The Commission will continue to use the Eniwetok rroving Ground and the area will remain closed to unauthorized persons.
