COMMISSION ACTION ON REPORT OF TEST DIRECTOR

R

1. At the meeting on the afternoon of June 16, 1948, the Commission received the preliminary report of the Test Director for Operation Sandstone and took the following action:

a. Agreed that the dissolution of Joint Task Force 7 would be appropriate when so ordered by the Joint Chiefs of Staff;

b. Accepted Captain Russell's report and agreed that the Commission directive of January 14, 1948 (ABC 9/2) to the Test Director was fulfilled;

c. Requested that Captain Russell have letters of commendation prepared, for the Chairman's signature, to those scientists who made outstanding contributions, and that other commendatory letters be prepared as appropriate;

d. Noted with approval that the General Manager had designated the Office of Santa Barbara Operations as the field agency of the Commission for administration of the Commission interest in the Eniwetok Proving Ground after dissolution of Joint Task Force 7; and

e. Accepted the recommendation that the framework of the Proof-test Division at Los Alamos Laboratory be maintained during the intervals between tests and that a steering committee be formed jointly among the Commission and Military Liaison Committee staffs.

2. The General Manager is requested that you take the necessary implementing action on this decision.

3. It is further requested that a copy of any implementing papers be re-reposited in the Office of the Secretary.
