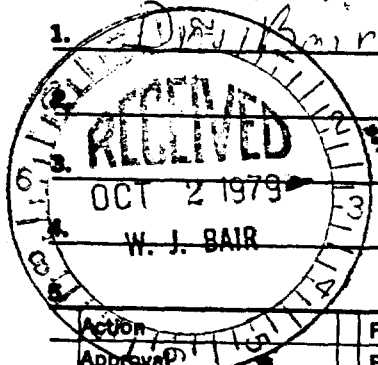

their scheduled visit to Enewetak from 15 Sep to 13 Sep because Morley Safer had to return to Honolulu NLT 16 Sep. After coordinating with the Enewetak Commander, Joint Task Group (CJTG); the Military Airlift Command; and Commander, Kwajalein, arrangements were made to arrive Enewetak on 13 Sep. On 13 Sep it was learned that only Morley Safer would return to Honolulu and the producer and crew wished to remain at Enewetak thru 18 Sep but were undecided about covering the Dose Assessment Conference. This information was passed to Pacific Support Office, Field Command (FCH). On Saturday, 15 Sep, CBS requested to cover the Conference and arrangements were made at Enewetak to obtain space on the ship and for them to return to Honolulu on 21 Sep.


(5) The presentation of the People of Enewetak's resolution at the end of the conference to DOI that they decided they want to return to Enjebi.
