a. PREPARE for Commission consideration a draft AEC position on cooperation with the United Kingdom and Canada in atomic energy matters; and

b. DOCUMENT the benefits to the U.S. atomic energy program which have accrued from the technical cooperation program or might be expected to accrue from an expansion of the technical cooperation program.

3. Appointment of Deputy General Counsel

The Deputy General Manager and the General Counsel recommended that Roger I. Harris, presently Assistant General Counsel at Hanford Operations Office, be appointed Deputy General Counsel, to replace Mr. Bennett Boskey. The Commission:

4. Attendance of Senator Magnuson as Official Observer at GREENHOUSE

Mr. Dean reported that Senator Warren Magnuson wished to attend Operation GREENHOUSE as an official observer while returning from Japan. Mr. Dean said that he had advised Senator McMahon of the plans for attendance at Operation GREENHOUSE by members of the Senate and House of Representatives other than the Joint Committee, and had pointed out to Senator McMahon the question of access to restricted data by members of Congress raised by these trips. After discussion the Commission:

AGREED that Senator Warren Magnuson would have access to the restricted data required in the capacity of official observer at Operation GREENHOUSE.
