Advance Notification to the United Kingdom and Canada of U.S. Atomic Tests (see AEC 483/26)

After Mr. Hall reviewed the events leading up to the meeting, Mr. Smyth referred to the fact that the Commission had notified the United States and Canada of earlier U.S. tests. The question raised by Defense and State was whether or not the same procedure should be followed for IVY.

Mr. Arneson pointed out that unless the UK and Canada were notified, serious repercussions might follow if the UK assumed upon detection of the tests that they were Russian in origin. Mr. Arneson stated that the Departments of State and Defense were in agreement that the UK and Canada should be notified.

In response to a question by Mr. Smyth, Mr. Arneson said that the British had notified the U.S. of the date of their recent test and that this information had been passed to AFOAT.
