As will be noted from the referenced memoranda, it has been the practice in the past to notify the United Kingdom and Canada of forthcoming United States atomic tests. This pattern was formally established for the GREENHOUSE and BUSTER-JANGLE series and was followed in the TUMBLER-SNAPPER series. 'At the suggestion of the Atomic Energy Commission, the procedure followed was oral notification shortly before each individual shot.

The United Kingdom reciprocated with similar notification of their recent test in Australia.

In view of the above, it is proposed that a similar pattern of oral notification be followed for the forthcoming IVY test unless you perceive objection. Your comments are requested.
