Dr. Lowman aboard the MRV PALUMBO called at 1525~~7~~ EDT thru the Oakland, Calif.,
highseas operator and requested the following messages be passed along:

Call the PRNC and have them advise the families of the crew of the
PALUMBO that all are safe and well after the passing of typhoon
OIGA.

Call Allen H. Seymour at 206-543-4257 and advise him that all
personnel had been evacuated from Eniwetok to Kwajalein during
the typhoon and they are not expected to return until Friday,
Oct. 27, 1972

Typhoon OIGA has passed to the west of Eniwetok and they (the Palumbo)
are standing about 4 to 6 miles south waiting for the wind and waves
to subside before they enter the harbor

Charges for this highseas call are to be transferred to the Palumbo Account

The PALUMBO is monitoring Channel 12, Station KXII, Oakland, Calif., and
may be contacted by radio thru ~~xxxx~~ by calling the Oakland Highseas
Operator.
